- Linden Oaks Hospital offers behavioral and mental health services, including inpatient and outpatient treatment plus recovery programs for depression, substance abuse, anxiety, eating disorders and more.
- Twelve outpatient locations in Naperville, Plainfield, St. Charles, Woodridge, Hinsdale, Addison, Palatine, Deerfield, Evanston, Glenview, Gurnee and Skokie.
- Over 20 therapists and psychologists co-embedded within primary care and specialty clinics across Endeavor Health to integrate physical and mental health care and better support our patients. Emergency departments and medical floors are also supported with Linden Oaks liaisons.
- A dedicated help line, (847) 432-5464 (847-HEALING), triages over 6,000 calls a month from individuals seeking services.

Partner since 2022, 3 years, \$1,250,666

- 3,300+ 50-minute mental health counseling sessions provided to students
- Through school district partnerships, CARES program has been replicated in 19 additional school districts through a variety of funding sources, multiplying the impact of Endeavor Health's funding of this pilot program



Partner since 2024, 3-year, \$189,000

- Engaged 1,150+ teens through 13,300+ visits with programming to enhance confidence, belonging, vitality, coping, and leadership skills
- 84% reported increased self confidence
- 71% reported increased ability to cope with stress



Partner since 2024, 2-year, \$627,000

- Completed construction of a new Food Pantry building in Wheaton and started food distributions in September
- Served 36,000+ individuals
- Started an online ordering pilot program for clients in Westmont (May) with plans to expand to Wheaton

- 70+ families exited the Transitional Housing Program
- 80%+ had stable to thriving employment
- 80%+ increased their household savings
- 90%+ decreased their consumer debt
- 80% existed to permanent housing

Additional Community Programs

Linden Oaks Hospital holds monthly **Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)** training for community members, educators/school administrators, not-for-profits and corporations. The goal of this training is to make responding to a mental health crisis as common as using CPR in a cardiac emergency. MHFA is an evidenced-based public education program that teaches people how to help someone with a mental health problem or crisis. Training focuses on skills that can be used until professional help is available and teaches participants to identify people who may need help with a mental illness and how to effectively communicate with them and guide them to appropriate professional health. Since 2011, more than 15,000 community members have been trained in MHFA.

Staff from **Haymarket Center**, a substance abuse treatment organization, are integrated within several Endeavor Health emergency departments and inpatient settings during daytime hours to respond to referrals from our crisis and assessment teams. This innovative collaboration provides peer support along with follow up resources and referrals as needed for Medicaid and uninsured patients who present with substance use disorders.
